



TRUCK MOUNT








INSTRUCTIONS


1. Remove plastic air deflector from the bumper that is attached to the bottom with some small fasteners. Remove the thin metal Air damper that is attached to the cross member frame of the truck (Keep all fasteners). Air damper must be modified or omitted for installation of this mount kit.

Remove the two existing tow hook (tow hook will be needed). Keep both bolts from the tow hook for later re-use on this mount kit.
Lower the two sway bar brackets from the bottom of the truck by removing the four bolts from PS and DS frame.



4. Hold the PS Side Plate (2) against the frame, aligning with the long existing bolt-holes from the tow hook. Using the existing bolts, secure it to the frame of the truck. Install the existing short bolt, into the existing tow hook hole from the bottom. Also, align the existing hole from the Sway bar bracket like a sandwich installation. Use the longer M-10 bolts provided.


5. On the side of the truck frame, drill out Ø.531 clearance hole for ½" bolts. Ignore the two larger holes. And install the proper ½ fasteners (7). In some models, there is one existing hole you can use without using the drilled hole.




6. Repeat step #3-4 for the DS Side Plate (3).

7. On the side of the frame, Re-use the Steering Gear Box bolt in the existing hole. Ignore the $\frac{1}{2}$ " hole.

8. Mount the PUSHBAR (1) in place between the two side plates using eight ½"-13x1-1/2" BOLTS (13) and eight ½"-13 LOCK NUTS (14). The centerline of the Pushbar Crosspin should be approximately 11" from the ground. The air dam and the bumper splash-guard of the vehicle may need to be altered to accommodate this height. Improper mounting height will result in uneven cutting edge wear.



9. Install the Rear Brace (4) onto the push bar with four ½" Bolts and Nuts (13&14). Toward the rear of the bracket, secure the Rear Brace onto the cross-frame with two 5 inch bolts. Spacer tubing must be inserted through the inside of the frame with the 5 inch bolts. Secure it onto the cross-frame of the truck with bolts-stick (11) and one nut (15).



10. It may be helpful to route the plow and light control harnesses at this point, prior to bumper re-installation.

11. Torque all fasteners as shown in the chart. Check and re-torque all fasteners after 5 hours of usage to ensure safe plow operation. Ensure all coolant lines and wires are clear of moving or hot components and tie up as necessary.
